# ONCE A SKI JUMPER, ALWAYS A SKI JUMPER

## THE SKI JUMPING LEGEND MAX BOLKART FROM OBERSTDORF LOOKS BACK ON HIS CAREER

A cosy room with a fireplace in the Hotel Freiberg in Oberstdorf: Here, Max Bolkart (88) sits on a comfortable bench at a table and tells us about his career as a ski jumper, which he ended in 1965. In a large shelf on the wall, there are many trophies, proving that he was very successful. During the World Ski Championships, Bolkart will keep his fingers crossed for Karl Geiger, the ski jumper from Oberstdorf, at home, in front of the television. For the 88-year-old, he is the favourite for the title: "Where others already start to tremble, Geiger keeps his cool and jumps respectively far."



### Respect for the landing, bad for the score

"I always had respect for the landing. To be sure and have a better landing, I brought myself into position already in the air. Therefore, I always got quite bad scores for style," Bolkart tells us. The Allgäuer excitedly looks at the current developments in his discipline. "Each season, the athletes jump farther, even if it is only half a metre. The scientific development behind the sport does not stand still", he says.

Bolkart himself also experimented with the materials. While telling his story, his eyes sparkle: "The Fins feared me as a competitor. At that time, I got a piece of paraffin wax and cheated a bit. I got up at 2 o'clock at night and polished my skis as long as they were smooth as glass". On Friday, he tried the skis for training and was excited. The comments were quick to come: "You have to pay attention to this Max".

Before he started his career as a ski jumper, Max Bolkart actually wanted to become a ski racer. But he always loved to jump over ramps. We used to erect ramps, which got higher and higher. And I often broke my skis," he tells us, laughing.

## Four-time German Champion and first West German winner of the Four Hills Tournament

Since Bolkart trained hard and always tried to make the best of a jump, he was very successful. Four times, he was German Champion in ski jumping. The highlight of his career came in 1959/60: He was the first West German to win the Four Hills Tournament.

This was the time of the Cold War. At that time, everybody was very proud of the athlete from Oberstdorf, because he challenged the title claimed by the East German athlete Helmut Recknagel. Latter had won the Four Hills Tournament two years in a row. It should take about 60 years, until an Oberstdorfer managed to win again on the local ski jumping hill: Karl Geiger won the opening competition of the 69th Four Hills Tournament in Oberstdorf.

# PROTECTED BY TESTS

## CORONA: WSC PARTICIPANTS ARE TESTED EVERY 48 HOURS

The FIS Nordic World Ski Championships can take place because the organisers provide Corona hygiene and safety measures, which are really sophisticated. For the World Championships, 4,500 participants (athletes, volunteers, officials, media representatives) are expected, of which “about 3,000 will be in Oberstdorf at the same time,” says WSC Managing Director Moritz Beckers-Schwarz.

Shortly before the start of the competitions, the measures have once again been updated, and the testing rhythm set to 48 hours. In the first days, there was a lot to do in the Test Centers, which are accommodated in the Ice Sports Center and the Cross-Country Stadium. The Ice Sports Center was mostly open for about ten hours a day, and it may have been about 800 persons, who came at the beginning, as a team officer said. The “schedule” was well filled and the appointments in the on-line booking system were in great demand.

Especially in the first days, when most of the participants arrived. The Covid 19 Test Centers had only little problems with postponements and some people with no appointments; quickly, the situation was controlled again by the committed, always friendly and experienced testers.

The first PCR test is followed by a first antigen test after a maximum of 48 hours, and a second antigen test after another two days. On the eighth day, the procedure starts all over again with another PCR test.

Persons, who are on duty on all days of the World Championships, will have undergone seven tests during the World Championships. Approximately, 13,000 PCR tests and 17,500 rapid tests will have been undertaken in the end. Moreover, many FFP-2 and medical masks protect the volunteers in Oberstdorf from viruses and bacteria.

# TAKING RESPONSIBILITY

## SUSTAINABILITY REPORT OF THE FIS NORDIC WORLD SKI CHAMPIONSHIPS 2021 IN OBERSTDORF

After 1987 and 2005, Oberstdorf is in the focus of the world of winter sports again. FIS Nordic World Ski Championships are not only a big event for athletes and millions of international fans, but also a challenge as well as an opportunity for the concept of sustainability.

This means one thing for the organisers of the FIS Nordic World Ski Championships 2021 and the Market Town Oberstdorf: Acting today, while making sure that coming (sports) generations are not compromised in their development.

The Bavarian sustainability strategy and the goals for sustainable winter sports development by the German Ski Federation (DSV) form the guidelines and a concrete input for the realisation of the global sustainability goals of the UN Agenda 2030 (Sustainable Development Goals – SDGs). This study has been elaborated by Prof. Dr. Ralf Roth (head of sustainability strategy in the OC, German Sport University Cologne, Foundation Safety in Ski Sports) and Frank Armbruster (expert, Foundation Safety in Ski Sports, German Ski Federation).

The sustainable development of Nordic winter sports is of elementary importance in Oberstdorf as far as the attitude to life and the future of the living space are concerned. Therefore, six sustainability measures were fixed, where the organisers strive to make an as positive as possible impact with the FIS Nordic World Ski Championships 2021:

**1. Self-commitment and sustainability management.** One member of the “Environment and Sustainability” committee is Johannes Rydzek from Oberstdorf, Olympic Champion and six-time Nordic Combined World Champion. “WSC in your home town is something special and I’m really looking forward to it”. In his bachelor’s thesis, he concerned himself with the sustainability of a large sports event using the example of the “Nordic Center Oberstdorf/Allgäu” also from an academic point of view.

### **2. Protection of natural resources.**

The Nordic Center in the Ried area and the ski jumping facilities at Schattenberg are located within a sensitive and unique biosphere. For the WSC, buildings, sports facilities and parts of cross-country ski tracks had to be newly built. A technically optimised and ecologically balanced planning made sure that adverse effects on nature and landscape could be minimised. Unavoidable interventions could mostly be compensated for already in their entirety.

### **3. Sustainable mobility management.**

These are the World Championships of short distances. Oberstdorf wants to reduce individual traffic in the long run and especially during sports events.

#### 4. Climate protection and power supply.

Also the FIS Nordic World Ski Championships 2021 has to contribute. Power generation from proprietary regenerative sources has a long tradition in Oberstdorf. More than 100 years ago, hydro-electric power plants were operated at the river Trettach. The FIS Nordic World Ski Championships 2021 and all sports facilities will be supplied with climate-neutral energy. A new power plant generates 6.3 million kWh.

#### 5. Future use, sustainable sports development.

Venues and sports facilities are the heart of World Championships. The goal is a long-time profitable future use of the facilities. The concept aims at all sport target groups: guests and locals, people of all ages – with or without handicap. A Nordic Training Center of the German Ski Federation and the German Ski Instructors Association will be integrated. Additionally, there will be special offers for classes and associations for education on sustainable development.

#### 6. Voluntary work, regional products and services.

Numerous volunteers are supporting the organisation of competitions in organised sports. About 1,500 volunteers from Germany and abroad are on duty during the FIS Nordic World Ski Championships 2021. As a tradition, voluntary work is highly appreciated and esteemed. Catering for athletes and volunteers wants to offer environmentally-friendly and mostly regional groceries as well as vegetarian dishes and fair trade products.

But the food rescuers are happy about each Euro donated in their collection boxes. “Now, we replenish both our booths every day“, Laurena tells us. In 2019, she initiated the food sharing movement in the Oberallgäu region and was really proud, when the organisers of the World Ski Championships gave her the chance to present the association during the World Championships. “This is a great chance to promote us and call the public’s attention to our ideals,” Laurena says. The foodsharing representatives get the groceries for the WSC from regional partners, from Oberstdorf and Kleinwalsertal. “Therefore, we also meet the requirements for sustainable World Championships,” Laurena says. “The offered groceries are still perfectly edible and alright even if the best before date has expired. Nothing has perished or must be thrown away,” she ensures.

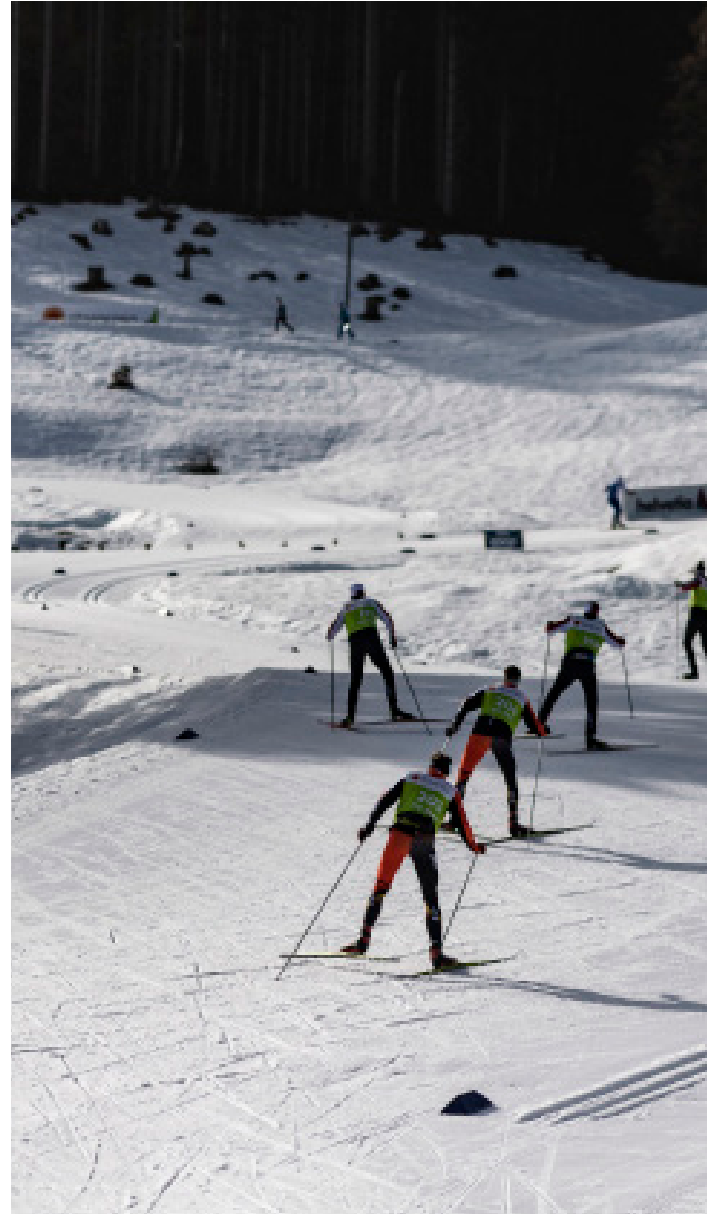
# WM-SPLITTER
